go back home, we found all our money had been placed on the tops of our bags of grain. That made us nervous but we were too far to return so we went on home.

We did pretty well for awhile with that grain, but we did eventually run out. Our dad wanted us to go back but he didn't want to send our brother Benjamin because he said if anything happened to him, it would just kill him. I told him I would personally be responsible for him and if anything happened to him, he could have my entire family in return. I had made my peace with God concerning what I had done with Joseph but was still dealing with the guilt. I wanted my father, and my God, to know I was willing to do what needed to be done to protect my youngest brother and my father.
